Fig 1: Students feedback on curriculum aspect of School of Agriculture (64 response)




Fig 2: Alumni feedback on curriculum aspect of School of Agriculture (26 responses)




Fig 4: Parent feedback on general aspect of School of Agriculture (57 responses)
